This month we write on 'Abuse' It is generally acknowledged that people with learning disabilities are at increased risk of abuse, possibly due to the environments where they live and personal characteristics that may heighten their risk.

In 2012, a BBC television Panorama programme showed patients at a residential care home near Bristol, (Winterbourne) being slapped and restrained under chairs, having their hair pulled and being held down as medication was forced into their mouths). The BBC programme exposed dreadful abuse at this care home for vulnerable adults, and that this deplorable treatment was being mirrored in some other care homes and hospitals for vulnerable people with learning disabilities We were promised by our government that it would never happen again in care homes throughout the country, but it is still happening today, many remain open as highlighted yet again by a more recent Panorama broadcast (Crisis in Care) shown on television this past month. We were shown staff who couldn't care less about the people they were supposed to be supporting, where patients were mocked and intimidated and often restrained either physically or by medication. The promise is constantly being broken. Our children and adults are supposed to be safe. People with learning disabilities can have challenging behavior but their complex needs must not be rewarded by abuse from staff.

We need to stop the cruel mistreatment of people with a learning disability. The Panorama programme spotlighted the way society still treats people with learning disabilities and Autism to this day. As well as Panorama, the Care Quality Commission also published a report into the use of restraint of people with learning disabilities and autism. It found that some people were not getting good care or treatment. Also, the publication of the LeDeR programme's 2018 annual report, shockingly found that some doctors were giving the reason for not restarting a persons heart as being because they had learning disabilities. This is totally unacceptable.

The National Autistic Society has started a petition to call on the government to end abuse. With your help to sign a petition now, we will be fighting for the rights of people with learning disabilities. Please help support the campaign to stop people with autism and learning disabilities being placed in Inpatient units. [Power Networks is commonly known as the 'Electricity Board'. They own and maintain electricity cables and lines across the South East and East of England. They deliver power locally, regardless of which company you pay your energy bills to].

UK Power Networks is offering to help those who need extra support during a power cut, with a <u>FREE</u> service. They understand that power cuts can be worrying especially if a member of your family needs electricity for medical reasons, are unwell or have specific communication needs. It does not matter if you have a young family or are of pensionable age, the Priority Services Team are there to provide you, or your family with extra support if you experience a power cut. Joining the register will ensure you receive extra support. They will provide you with a number to call 24 hrs a day, and in some cases tailored support.




