CARERS EMERGENCY PLANNING SERVICE:

If you are caring for someone over the age of 18, it's important you get a carer's emergency card (it's free). This will ensure that they will be safe if you're caught up in an emergency. Carers could also sign up to a repeat prescription delivery service if the person they care for is reliant on regular prescription medication.



The Office of National Statistics (ONS) has confirmed that it is not too late for those who have yet to complete a Census 2021 form.


You can no longer complete the Census online, so if you have an access code, it is too late to use it. The only available way now to complete one is via a paper version.

FREE P.P.E. FOR UNPAID CARERS LIVING SEPARATELY
