# NEW CHANGING PLACES FACILITY FOR NORFOLK

ROARR! Dinosaur Adventure Park have announced they have a brand new Changing Places facility open to the public on their site. This will be a welcome addition to a host of existing accessibility provision at the park, including accessible pathways, mobility scooter and wheelchair hire, and an accessible quiet/sensory room.

Going to the toilet comfortably is something that so many of us take for granted, but it can be a huge barrier for profoundly disabled people and their carers.

The Changing Places consortium campaigns on behalf of the quarter of a million people in the UK who cannot use standard accessible toilets. These include people with profound and multiple learning disabilities, motor neurone disease, multiple sclerosis, or cerebral palsy, as well as older people.

Those seeking to locate a suitable toilet providing safety and comfort can consult the Changing Places Toilet Map and find facilities with more space and the right equipment, including height adjustable changing benches and hoists.

The coronation of King Charles III and Queen Camilla will take place at Westminster Abbey in London on Saturday 6th May.

King Charles's coronation ceremony starts at 11am, before the King's procession begins at approximately 2pm. The procession which will run for around 1.3 miles and then the royal family will gather on the balcony of Buckingham Palace.

The UK government has announced that Monday 8th May will be an official, extra bank holiday to mark the special day, so we will be celebrating over the long weekend.

Here's some ideas how to celebrate the event that weekend:

- Organise a street party
  - Wear fancy dress
- Play "Pin the Crown on the King"
- Play "Pass the Parcel" with the parcel wrapped in gold paper
  - Make paper crowns
  - Create & bury a time capsule
- Make the "Quiche Le Reign" (opposite) for a family meal.

Apparently the King and Queen Consort have personally chosen Coronation Quiche as their celebratory recipe. 70 years after Coronation Chicken was created for Elizabeth II's coronation, Charles and Camilla selected a personal favourite as their recommended dish for Coronation Big Lunches. The recipe features spinach, broad beans and tarragon. Have a go!

# **CORONATION QUICHE**

# NOW MAKE IT YOURSELF

You will need a 20cm flan tin

#### Ingredients

- Pastry
125g plain flour
Pinch of salt

25g cold butter, diced 25g lard
2 tablespoons milk

Or 1 x 250g block of readymade shortcrust pastry

- Filling 125ml milk

175ml double cream

2 medium eggs

1 tablespoon chopped fresh tarragon

Salt and pepper

100g grated cheddar cheese

180g cooked spinach, lightly chopped

60g cooked broad beans or soya beans

#### Method

1 To make the pastry: Sieve the flour and salt into a bowl; add the fats and rub the mixture together using your finger tips until you get a breadcrumb-like texture.

Add the milk a little at a time and bring the ingredients together into a dough.

Cover and allow to rest in the fridge for 30-45 minutes.

- Lightly flour the work surface and roll out the pastry to a circle a little larger than the top of the tin and approximately 5mm thick.
- 3 Line the tin with the pastry, taking care not to have any holes or the mixture could leak. Cover and rest for a further 30 minutes in the fridge.
- 4 Preheat the oven to 190C (370F).
- Line the pastry case with greaseproof paper, add baking beans and bake blind for 15 minutes, before removing the greaseproof paper and baking beans.
- 6 Reduce the oven temperature to 160C (320F).
- Beat together the milk, cream, eggs, herbs and seasoning.
- Scatter 1/2 of the grated cheese in the blind-baked base, top with the chopped spinach and broad beans and herbs, then pour over the liquid mixture.
- If required give the mixture a delicate stir to ensure the filling is evenly dispersed but be careful not to damage the pastry case.
- D Sprinkle over the remaining cheese. Place into the oven and bake for 20-25 minutes until set and lightly golden.
