Sensory Room

We thought it would be good to put pen to paper and let you see what we have now transformed one of our office rooms at Tavern Lane in Dereham into. We have a state of the art sensory room which opens a host of new experiences to people with learning disabilities.

Our room consists of state-of-the-art sensory equipment designed to stimulate the senses through sound, touch, and sight. The equipment we have installed so far includes bubble tubes, mirrors, lighting, projector, speakers, highly tactile accessories, bean bags and soft mats. We know that providing a room such as this helps to promote wellbeing for people with learning disabilities and other vulnerable groups in the community, and for children, older people and those with mental health and long-term illnesses or dementia. Our room can be used in so many different ways - calming, exploring, relief from pain, communication skills, social interaction, independence, safety and security just to mention a few.

We are still fundraising for this project, so we can add further sensory equipment and toys to enhance the experience of the room. We are planning an open day for the sensory room very soon.....so watch this space! If you have any questions, please do feel free to contact the office.

Norfolk Family Carers

Norfolk Family Carers are an organisation that offer a range of services to support—family carers. They are pleased to announce their new personal development fund for young adult carers.

The new scheme is offering grants up to £250 for those aged between 16 – 24 year olds who are providing care for a family member needing help due to a disability, physical or mental health problems or addicitons. The grant is available to help them gain new skills, whilst having a break from their caring role. They offer support in finding a suitable course.

To qualify, the young adult carers must, live in Norfolk, demonstrate they are unable to fund the course themselves, can provide evidence their household income is below £25,000, and be able to attend the course without assistance. Applications by professional referral only. Courses must be in the U.K.




